

BLUEBERRIES

- Berkeley** – Midseason. Tall, spreading bush.
Large, light blueberries
- Bluecrop** – Midseason. Considered best all around variety for consistent yields of large, high-quality fruit. Erect, tall growth. Attractive shrub
- Blueray** – Midseason. Large, highly flavored crisp berries. Vigorous, tall, attractive shrub with red wood in winter. Tolerates more heat than Bluecrop
- Collins** – Midseason. Large, excellent quality berries on erect, attractive plants. Good for the Northwest
- Coville** – Late. Tall, open, spreading plants. Unusually large leaves. Long clusters of very large light blueberries
- Earliblue** – Early. The first to ripen. Large, light blueberries of excellent flavor. Upright plant with large, heavy leaves
- Herbert** – Late midseason. Large fruit. Medium dark blue, tender flesh with a huckleberry like flavor. Vigorous and open spreading plant. Consistently productive
- Ivanhoe** – Early to midseason. Large dark blue, firm, crisp, tart berries
